

Waterloo Regional Health Network (WRHN, pronounced wren) is currently seeking to hire Anesthesiologists for full-time and locum positions at Midtown and Queen's Blvd. sites.

About Waterloo Region



Waterloo Region is one of Canada's fastest-growing communities, projected to reach one million residents by 2050. Grand River Hospital and St. Mary's General Hospital, now officially merged as the Waterloo Regional Health Network (WRHN), currently serve a catchment area of more than 1.4 million people, representing over 10% of Ontario's provincial population and growing.

Known for its innovative tech sector and home to two of the country's highest-ranking universities and Canada's largest trade college, Waterloo Region offers the amenities of a large multicultural urban centre with the warmth and tight-knit community associated with smaller towns.

About WRHN



WRHN serves over 650,000 patients annually across multiple sites, offering a wide range of community-focused programs. Queen's Blvd. is a Regional Cardiac Care Centre and Centre of Excellence for Respiratory and Thoracic Care, while Midtown hosts key regional programs including cancer, stroke, renal, pediatric, mental health, and hepatobiliary surgery.

In 2019, WRHN launched a master plan - guided by 90+ years of partnerships and expert input to modernize and expand infrastructure. The future of WRHN is focused on caring for more patients and their families by expanding programs and services, adding more beds, and ensuring access to world-class care close to home. These efforts will help reduce wait times and strengthen the support patients receive when they need it most.

The Anesthesia department supports approximately 10,000 surgical procedures each year across a wide range of programs. Services are provided to a busy obstetrical unit, acute pain service, and surgical programs in orthopedic, spine, cardiac, thoracic, ENT, urology, gynecology, plastic, maxillofacial, general, ophthalmology and emergency surgery. The scope of practice provides both adult and some pediatric anesthesiology. We have added a dedicated regional block room and electrophysiology lab. A specific subgroup of anesthesiologists within the department provides services for our cardiac program. In addition to elective rooms, we run two pre-surgical clinics a day with NP support, two acute surgical rooms a day, and two emergent rooms after hours.

Anesthesiologists are encouraged to pursue faculty appointments through our affiliation with McMaster University Michael G. DeGroote School of Medicine. We teach medical students and residents, with an anesthesia residency program starting in 2027.

Candidates must be eligible for independent practice licensure with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario, and FRCPC certification by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada in Anesthesiology.
