


Occupancy and Activity information

This section describes the occupancy of the hospital including the use of acute care beds and intensive care unit (ICU) beds. This includes both COVID and non-COVID care. Hospitals in the region have added a total of 235 new beds and hundreds of additional staff during the pandemic, across the seven hospitals.
