

## Chemotherapy – “Fridge Sheet”

**Contact the Patient Triage Line at 519-749-4380 if you experience any of the following symptoms:**

- A fever of 38.3°C (101°F) or higher
- A fever of 38.0°C (100.4°F) that lasts for more than one hour
- Sudden onset of shortness of breath
- Persistent and severe nausea or vomiting that continues for more than 24 hours
- Persistent diarrhea that lasts more than 48 hours
- Constipation that lasts more than 72 hours
- Sore throat or mouth (red or sore areas seen in the mouth)
- Severe night sweats that require changing your night clothes & bed sheets
- Pain or burning when urinating
- Any weakness or numbness in your legs, arms, difficulty walking, inability to urinate or you have a loss of bowel or bladder control
- Sudden or severe rash, hives, itching or swelling
- Unusual swelling of an arm or leg
- Pain, redness, swelling or warmth at injection site where chemotherapy was administered
- Sudden, increased, changed or uncontrolled pain
- Unusual bruising or bleeding (i.e., with bowel movements or urine)

**Important Note:** If these symptoms occur **after 4:00 pm**, on a weekend, or on a holiday, please go directly to the **Emergency Department** at Grand River Hospital or your local hospital.
